

The Most Holy Trinity

Go...and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

- Matthew 28:19

THE TRINITY IS LOVE

Theologians throughout the Christian centuries have spilled much ink (and, on occasion, some blood) in describing and defining the mystery of the Holy Trinity. One of the earliest, most poetic, and beautiful descriptions comes from St. Augustine in *De Trinitas*, wherein he describes the Trinity as One (the Father) who loves, One (the Son) who is loved, and One (the Spirit) who is love. And these three Ones are also one Three.

It might be wisest for us to leave the technical wranglings to the academic theologians, and focus on the fact that the three Persons of the Trinity are indeed persons; they are best known and understood in their love for each other and for us. We are made in the image of those loving persons, and our best relationships are lived out in the context of love. Truly loving relationships are inexhaustible mysteries to be lived in joy. If this is true of our human relationships, how much more so is it true of our relationship with the Trinity. And how much more does it call upon us to be joyful, loving witnesses of the holy mystery of the One-in-Three. This is the mystery to which we were called when we were chosen to be God's own, baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

There are plenty of "treasures" in our tradition that if resurrected today would cause anxious moments for bishops! Many concern marriage. There was a time when the church "consecrated" both virgins dedicated to prayer and charity, and brides dedicated to husband and family. Virgins were blessed in the sanctuary of the church, and brides in the sanctuary of the home. The custom of blessing the bride in the marriage chamber was standard in England, Ireland, Spain, and France until the eleventh century.

If the groom (the groom's side planned the wedding) chose from the full menu of liturgy, there would be a blessing of the bridal room, solemn evening prayer on the eve and morning prayer on the day of the wedding, a blessing at the church door of the spouses, and then in the church for the wife alone during Mass, and Communion. After the feast, a priest would represent the bride's father in presiding over the legal process by which the bride transferred from her father's clan to her husband's. Some enduring customs hearken back to these days when marriage was seen as a contract between men (the bride's father and the groom) and was not so much about living out one's baptismal call, and certainly not about the equality of the spouses in Christ. Happily, this baptismal focus has been restored and unhelpful customs set aside by today's marriage rite.

May 16/17 members of our parish community –437 of them, signed the petition opposing Senate Bill 128, (Physician assisted Suicide.) These petitions were delivered by a member of the Social Justice Ministry to the office of Senator Richard Pan, our area's State Senator. Appreciation goes to all who took time to sign this petition. Special appreciation goes to Fr. Felipe, who gave his support to this pro-life effort, opposing assisted suicide, and to the men and women who manned the tables with the petition. Euthanasia and assisted suicide stand in contradiction to the Catholic understanding of life, and the dignity of people. They should never be permitted.

In April, at the Women in the World Summit, Hillary Clinton delivered an address which included comment concerning abortion. Mrs. Clinton said: "Laws have to be backed up with resources, religious beliefs and structural biases have to be changed." HEALTH MINISTRY

A Free Blood Pressure Screening Clinic will be held Sunday, June 7^t, in the parish hall from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm. These screenings are presented to increase awareness and knowledge of prevention, detection, and management of high blood pressure and are provided free by your Health Ministry Team.

Because it is possible to have high blood pressure without any symptoms - and because untreated high blood pressure can cause serious problems even death - it is often called the "silent killer." Come and let the nurses of our parish help you monitor and control your blood pressure.

What is high blood pressure and why is it important to you? High blood pressure is a common condition and is determined by the amount of blood your heart pumps and the amount of resistance to blood flow in your arteries. The more blood your heart pumps and the narrower your arteries, the higher your blood pressure. You can have high blood pressure for years without any symptoms. Uncontrolled yhis increases your risk of serious health problems, including heart attack and stroke.. Fortunately, high blood pressure can be easily detected. And once you are aware of it you can work with your doctor to control it.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CENTER

Because of the deteriorating condition of the campus classrooms the Parish decided to build the Religious Education Center. The old classrooms were hot in summer and cold in winter. The classes held in the old hall were subject to having ceiling tiles fall on the students. During the planning phase it was decided that the parish would provide modern, up-to-date classrooms for our CFF students. A committee was formed to determine the types of desks and chairs, and the colors that would be used in the classrooms. A separate committee was formed to ensure that the state of the art audio visual equipment was available to our catechists. The results of all this planning are obvious when you enter any of the classrooms. The question is though, do the students appreciate the fact that our parishioners have, and still are, giving of their treasure to provide the students with these outstanding facilities. During Lent, Sr. Kathy and the catechists challenged the students to give up something they liked for Lent and to donate the money they would have spent to help pay off our loan on the Religious Education Center. If there is any doubt about their appreciation the \$3,291.69 they collection should put that doubt to rest. Thank you CFF students for your sacrifice, and thank you Sr. Kath and catechists for giving them the opportunity to show their appreciation.

La Santísima Trinidad

31, de mayo 2015

LA TRINIDAD DE AMOR

Una de las más antiguas, más poéticas y más hermosas descripciones de la Santísima Trinidad se halla en el libro *De Trinitate*, por san Agustín. Allí, el santo describe a la Trinidad como Uno que ama (el Padre), Uno que es amado (el Hijo) y Uno que es el amor (el Espíritu Santo). Y esos tres Unos suman Uno solo.

Tal vez lo mejor para nosotros sea dejar las dificultades técnicas de este misterio a los teólogos profesionales, y enfocarnos en el hecho que las tres Personas de la Santísima Trinidad son precisamente *personas*; se les conoce y se les comprende en su amor mutuo y en su amor hacia nosotros. Hemos sido creados a imagen y semejanza de esas tres Personas amorosas, y nuestras mejores relaciones se viven en el contexto del amor. Las relaciones verdaderamente amorosas son misterios inagotables que se expresan en una profunda felicidad. Y si esto es así en nuestras relaciones humanas, ¡cuánto más lo será en nuestra relación con la Santísima Trinidad! Y, ¡cuánto más somos llamados a dar un testimonio alegre y amoroso de este sagrado misterio de los Tres que son Uno! Este es el misterio que fuimos llamados a vivir cuando fuimos escogidos como hijos de Dios, bautizados en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo.

LECTURAS DE LA SEMANA

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

MINISTERIO DE SALUD

Una clínica gratuita de la presión arterial estará dando servicio el Domingo, 07 de junio, en el salón parroquial de 8:30 am a 12:30 pm. Este proyecto se presentara para aumentar la conciencia y el conocimiento de la prevención, de la detección y el tratamiento de la hipertensión arterial y se proporcionan gratuitamente por el Ministerio del Equipo de Salud. Debido a que es posible tener la presión arterial alta sin ningún síntoma - y porque la presión arterial alta no tratada puede causar problemas graves, incluso la muerte - a menudo se llama el "asesino silencioso". Ven y deja que las enfermeras de nuestra ayuda parroquial te supervisen y controlen su presión arterial. ¿Qué es la presión arterial alta y por qué es importante para usted? La presión arterial alta es una condición común y está determinada por la cantidad de sangre que pasa por sus bombas cardíacas y la cantidad de resistencia al flujo sanguíneo en las arterias. La mayor cantidad de sangre bombeada por el corazón y las arterias más estrechas, más alta es la presión arterial. Usted puede tener arterial alta presión por años sin ningún síntoma. Y estos síntomas incontrolados aumenta el riesgo de problemas de salud graves, como ataques al corazón y derrames cerebrales .. Afortunadamente, la presión arterial alta se puede detectar fácilmente. Y una vez que son conscientes de que se puede trabajar con su médico para controlarla.
