

## TRUE BLINDNESS

Bartimaeus caused a stir. Normally he sat by the side of the road being a "good blind beggar." But one day Jesus passed nearby. Bartimaeus jumped up and called out to Jesus. We can imagine him turning toward the direction of the commotion and noise. Bartimaeus probably had his arms outstretched as he shouted out to the son of David.

The people who knew him were embarrassed by his outburst. They tried to hush him up and get him to sit back down by the roadside. Their actions spoke volumes: "Bartimaeus, you're not fit for Jesus." But it was okay for them and other "sighted" people to follow Jesus. In today's readings, we learn that true blindness is not a condition of our eyes but of our hearts .

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

In the tangled but fascinating history of penance in the Church, the Irish "tariff" system helped us survive the collapse of the old system of public canonical penance and prepared the way for a new system that emerged in the twelfth century. The old form was unrepeatable, public, dealt with serious community matters, and regulated by the bishops as chief reconcilers. The new form had a more intimate setting of penitent and confessor, was extremely repeatable, and applied to everyone. The old canonical form was closed to children, who were hardly capable of the very grown-up sins listed, or their demanding remedies. The old form was likewise closed to clerics, who were protected in a sense by the very nature of the discipline.

In the new Irish form the penitent directly named sins, or answered direct questions by the priest. Sometimes, the penitent would recite a long formula accusing him- or herself in a general way of all sorts of sins, even from the distant past. Next, priest and penitent together would lie prostrate before the altar and recite several of the psalms with penitential themes. Finally, the priest would pronounce a judgment, deciding what form and duration the penance should take, normally insisting that the person return for reconciliation once the penances were completed.

## PARISH STEWARDSHIP

### PASTORAL COUNCIL

The meeting opened with a prayer for the Pope's visit to the USA. Minutes were approved and corrections made.

The White Elephant Chairman for next year will meet with the Council and present a plan on the running of the event.

The Mr. & Miss St. Paul fundraiser is going well. First counting of tickets was October 3rd. A status report will be given at the next meeting.

The Fall Festival was a success, lower attendance than last year due to the heat. The financial report will be issued at the next meeting. The Pastoral Council will be chairing the Festival next year. Suggestion was made on moving the date to escape the heat a little. Entertainment and Horse Show will not be scheduled simultaneously next year. Need more Spanish entertainment.

The St. Lorenzo Mass wasn't well attended. A recommendation was made to research the cost of purchasing a statue of St. Lorenzo.

The Feasibility Study for the Diocesan and Parish Capital Campaign will be presented to the Finance Council in October.

Missalettes will no longer be purchased for the church, starting with Advent. Limited number of copies of the prayers for the Sunday Masses will be printed and placed in the pews.

Fr. Joyle will lead a 6 week Bible Study program beginning October 22nd. Classes start at 6:30pm. Call the office to register for the class.

## Trigésimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

### 25 de octubre 2015

#### VERDADERA CEGUERA

Bartimeo causó tremenda conmoción. Por lo regular él estaba sentado al borde del camino siendo un "buen mendigo ciego". Pero un buen día pasó Jesús cerca de ahí. Bartimeo se puso de pie en un salto y le gritó a Jesús. Nos podemos imaginar como se daba vuelta en dirección al ruido y la conmoción. Probablemente tenía los brazos extendidos al gritarle al hijo de David.

Los que lo conocían se sentían azorados de sus gritos. Trataron de hacerle callar y que se volviera a sentar al borde del camino. Sus acciones decían mucho: "Bartimeo, tú no eres digno de Jesús". Pero sí estaba bien que ellos y otras personas "con vista" siguieran a Jesús. En las lecturas de hoy, aprendemos que la verdadera ceguera no es una condición de los ojos sino del corazón.

#### EL DIA DE TODOS LOS DIFUNTOS

Noviembre es el mes para recordar a nuestros seres queridos. 01 de noviembre Día de Todos los Santos, y el 2 de noviembre es día de los difuntos. #### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En varias ocasiones, Jesús le declara al recién sanado: "tu fe te ha salvado" (Marcos 10:52). Todos los cristianos deseamos ser salvados. Y, ¿qué es la salvación? La palabra "salvación" viene del latín *salus* que también significa "salud". La salvación es el bienestar en todas sus formas. Según Jesús este *shalom*, *salam*, *salus*, salvación, paz y bien se consigue por medio de la fe. Hay que tener un deseo profundo de tenerlo, para así pedirlo: "Jesús, Hijo de David, ten piedad de mí" (Marcos 10:47). La salvación no llega a quienes la esperan sentados en una iglesia, más bien, llega a los que se mueven y obran por ella.

#### MEDITATION

*Pescadores, reflexionad, volved a vuestro corazón.*

Hay muchas cosas que causa de la debilidad humana no logramos cumplir, pero, si verdaderamente queremos, con la inspiración de Dios, podemos encontrar el amor en nuestro corazón. Existen a veces muchas cosas que no logramos sacar de nuestro granero, pero no tenemos excusa cuando se trata de nuestro corazón. No nos dicen: "Id hasta Oriente, y buscad el amor; navegad hacia el occidente y encontrareis el amor" No nos ordenan regresar al interior de nuestro corazón, donde la cólera nos hace salir a menudo. Así como lo dice el profeta: *Pescadores, reflexionad, regresad a vuestro corazón.*

Lo que el Señor, nos pide no se encuentra en países lejanos; nos envía la interior de nosotros mismos, a nuestro corazón, porque ha puesto en nosotros lo que nos pide. La caridad perfecta no es otra que la buena voluntad del alma; a propósito de ésta, los ángeles proclaman a los pastores: *paz en la tierra a los hombres de buena voluntad.* Trabajemos, pues, con toda nuestras fuerzas, con la ayuda de Dios, para conceder el primer puesto en nuestra alma a la bondad y no a la maldad, a la paciencia y no a la cólera, a la benevolencia y no a la envidia, a la humildad y no al orgullo. En fin, que la dulzura de la caridad tome de tal manera posesión de nuestro corazón que ya no quede sitio en él para la amargura del odio.
