PASTORAL COUNCIL

The meeting was opened by Paul Pham. Minutes were approved after corrections were made.

Old Business:

The Diocesan One Campaign & St. Paul Campaign held their first meeting. The Advanced Gifts chairpersons have been selected. Kick off will be April 3, beginning with a dinner. Details to follow.

Liturgy Committee approved purchasing 500 small binders to hold the "Order of the Mass" cards and hymns.

New Business:

Research continues to find a low cost option for seasonal hymns. A license is necessary for copying music.

Lenten Program is planned on Palm Sunday, March 27, to be led by Michael Poirier.

There are been several cars broken into during Mass. Announcements will be made to be more careful what you leave valuables visible in your vehicle. Place them in the trunk.

The door monitoring system in the Religious Goods Store has been repaired.

The Wi-Fi Fiber Optics network installation in the church is completed. All that remains is the installation of Access points needed to connect the network to the remote thermostats. Estimated completion is Easter weekend.

Dale Yamamoto presented a strategy and plan to implement Young Adults Ministry, stressing the importance of this ministry.

The Gente Punte is planning several raffles to raise funds for the Spanish Outreach Program. Due to ongoing campaigns this will take place in July.

Members of the Finance Council will make presentations at Mass for the Annual Catholic Appeal, February 20/21.

The Diocese announced a 24 Hours for the Lord Services Friday, March 4 to noon Saturday March in selected parishes. Confessions will be heard during this 24 hour service.

Bible classes will begin again after Easter.

PASSION

The word "passion" connotes deep, focused engagement. It also relates to passivity, interestingly. The deeply passionate person in the Gospel narrative from Luke is Jesus. He appears passive, but he is not. He is wholly self-possessed and wholly present for the one day that begins on Thursday evening at his last meal with his apostles and ends with his burial before sunset the next day. Then follows the long Sabbath silence.

The narrative of the Passion is read whole and without pause on the Palm Sunday of the Passion. This story, found in each of the Gospels, is unchanging. We are the ones who change. Each year, we bring ourselves with another year's history to hear and heed the story we so badly need. Life has its way with us, and we look again to the Passion narratives to learn to follow.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

What day is today? Ask most folks strolling home from church today and they will reply "Palm Sunday." Not too long ago, today was known as the "Second Sunday of the Passion," and in 1970 it was renamed "Passion Sunday." This made some sense, since the procession recalling Christ's entry into Jerusalem is usually only celebrated once in a parish on this day, but the Passion is proclaimed solemnly at every liturgy. In its most recent incarnation, the name for this day includes both aspects of the celebration: "Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord." In the United States today, most worshipers are provided with palm branches, although in northern Europe pussy willows are favored, and in Italy olive branches are the norm.

When our calendar was reformed, the entire structure of the week to come was revised even as the traditional name, "Holy Week," was retained. The major benefit of the restructuring of our calendar is to help us see that the Triduum, the great three days beginning at sunset this Thursday and extending until sunset on Easter Sunday, is at the heart of the Christian life.

Today, as you ponder the Lord's Passion, you may consider your response to so great a gift. Centuries ago, good Christians vowed to go on pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Today, at least once in your lifetime, promise to participate faithfully in the liturgies. Now begins the Church's annual baptismal retreat: don't be left out!

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La liturgia oficial de la Iglesia para el Domingo de Ramos es algo paradójica. Entramos proclamando Hosannas con cantos y vítores y al poco tiempo estamos gritando: "¡crucifícalo, crucifícalo!" Según el rito la lectura del Evangelio y la consagración de la Eucaristía se hacen dentro del templo, pero se comienza afuera del templo con la bendición de los ramos.

En Estados Unidos y otros países latinoamericanos se usan palmas en lugar de ramos. En Europa, normalmente, se usan ramos de olivos. Últimamente en Colombia para proteger la palma de cera del Quindío, se les ha pedido a los fieles que usen ramitas de plantas o ramos de flores. Estoy de acuerdo hay que proteger el ambiente, pero admito que prefiero las palmas, ya que es difícil poner un ramo de olivo o de flores detrás de una imagen sagrada colgada en la pared. Esta es una costumbre latina que nos recuerda que los "hosannas" y el "crucifícalo" del domingo de ramos nos acompañan todos los días del año.

RAICES DE LA MISERICORDIA

Raíces de la Misericordia y de sus obras en la Sagrada Escritura.- La etimología procede del latín *miserere* (misericordia, necesidad) y *cor/cordis* (corazón) y se identifica con tener un corazón solidario con aquellos que tienen necesidad. Por eso, en el lenguaje corriente se identifica la misericordia con la compasión y el perdón. Esta identificación, aunque sea válida, oculta la riqueza concreta que para la Biblia se pone bajo la palabra *miserericordia*. En efecto, para el pueblo de Israel la misericordia surge a partir de la confluencia de dos corrientes de pensamiento: la compasión, con la piedad que comporta, y la fidelidad, con el amor como exigencia. Por eso, no es extraño que las traducciones más habituales oscilen entre las palabras misericordia y amor, pasando por ternura, piedad, compasión, clemencias, bondad y gracia o don de Dios, ofreciéndonos así un concepto más genérico y amplio. De hecho, desde el principio hasta el fin. Dios manifiesta su ternura ante la miseria humana y, a su vez, el hombre debe mostrar misericordioso hacia su prójimo, a imitación del "Dios, Señor de la misericordia" (Sb 9, 1) y del "Dios y Padre de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Padre de las misericordias" (2Corintios 1, 3). Al definir la *miserericordia*, los libros del Antiguo Testamento usan sobre todo dos expresiones. En primer lugar está el término *hésed*, que indica una actitud profunda de bondad y significa también gracia y amor. El segundo vocablo es *ratham*, que en su raíz denota el amor de la madre que comparte bondad, ternura, paciencia, comprensión y disposición a perdonar. La traducción griega más habitual de ambos y su uso preferente en el Nuevo Testamento es *éleos*, de donde surge la invocación litúrgica: *Kyrie eléison: Señor ten piedad/misericordia, así como la palabra eleemosyne, "lismona" (del latín)*
