### HOPE AND FORGIVENESS

There were some interesting conceptions of sin prevalent in the time of the Hebrew scriptures. There was the belief that God punished sin immediately. Those who suffered disease or misfortune were, therefore, sinners getting their due from the Almighty.

Today's first reading hints at another kind of God. When David admits his sin, Nathan declares, "The LORD on his part has forgiven your sin" (2 Samuel 12:13b). Here was not a vengeful God but a merciful God. What good news that must have been to David and those who, like him, could be honest enough to admit their sinfulness!

Jesus is the good news of God's mercy and forgiveness incarnate. Without Jesus, perhaps the good news would have been too good to believe, too difficult to imagine. But there he is in today's Gospel, the God-man, forgiving a sinner and declaring that she is forgiven because of her great love.

There is hope, then, for the rest of us sinners, if only we love enough!

### CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Our Dream Continues- In Service to All campaign is ongoing. As of June 2<sup>nd</sup> 138 families pledged \$478,213.72. With over 2,000 registered parishioners this is a very small percentage of our Parish family.

Our campaign volunteers have been making home visits and telephone calls to insure that all members of the Parish are given an opportunity to be active participants in the campaign, and to make pledges.

If you attended Mass here last week-end you are aware that parishioners who had not yet pledged were asked to fill out a pledge card at Mass. These pledge cards were entered into our campaign accounting system. Because of the time requirement for submission of bulletin items, the number of Parishioners taking advantage of this opportunity is not available.

On June 6, 7, and 8<sup>th</sup> our volunteers placed phone calls to Parishioners who had not taken advantage of the many opportunities to pledge. Even with these efforts our volunteers were not be able to personally contact everyone.

On Thursday June 10<sup>th</sup> Parishioners who had not been contacted were mailed a pledge card and a postage paid return envelope. If you received this letter, please return the pledge card. We understand that not everyone can make a monetary pledge to our campaign, but we would appreciate the pledge card being returned.

We would hope that you will consider a sacrificial offering to help repay our loan and to Support the Bishops ONE campaign. A \$5 pledge over 3 years (less than a weekly Big Mack or a Starbucks coffee) would permit a pledge of \$780.00. If 200 families would make this sacrifice we will meet our \$600,000 goal.

**Solitary Confinement**

June is "Torture Awareness Month." Solitary confinement is a form of torture. Pope Francis in 2014 stated: "One form of torture is confinement in high security prisons." He went on to say, "As shown by studies out by various human rights organizations, the lack of contact with other human beings induce mental and physical suffering such as paranoia, anxiety, depression, weight loss and significantly increase suicidal tendency.

On any given day in the U.S. approximately 80,000 to 100,000 people are held in solitary confinement for months, years or even decades. What is solitary confinement? 22-24 hours a day in a cell alone or with another person: removed from meaningful contact with other human beings; no access to rehabilitative or education programming, and sensory deprivation.

Be informed: Pray or Peace: Work for Justice.

### HEALTH MINISTRY

#### SUMMER HEAT—Another silent killer

One of the biggest health hazards effecting our region during the summer is heat.

We don't realize how deadly heat can be. In contrast to the visible, destructive and violent nature of fire, floods and earthquakes, heat is another "silent killer," Human bodies dissipate heat by varying the rate and depth of blood circulation, by losing water through the skin and sweat glands.

The body does everything it can to maintain 98.6 degrees inside. Heat disorders happen when the body can't maintain that temperature. Disorders can range from simple discomfort to serious injury and even death, e.g. sunburn, heat cramps, exhaustion or heat stroke. They all share one common feature, a person has overexposed or over exercised for his or her age, physical condition and the weather.

Reduce your chances of disorders by following a few simple steps:

Slow Down—reduce strenuous activities or reschedule then to a cooler time of day.

Dress for summer—lightweight, light colored clothing, cover all exposed skin with high SPF sunscreen and wear a wide brimmed hat.

Drink plenty of water, avoid caffeine,, soda and fruit juices.

Check on the elderly, young children and people with health problems or disabilities.

Keep pets indoors or provide them with shade and plenty of water. Do not leave pets, or anyone else in a closed, parked vehicle

## UnDécimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 12 de junio 2016

### ESPERANZA Y PERDÓN

Había algunas concepciones interesantes sobre el pecado que prevalecían en la época de las Escrituras hebreas. Estaba la creencia de que Dios castigaba inmediatamente el pecado. Los que sufrían alguna enfermedad o desgracia eran, por lo tanto, pecadores que recibían su merecido del Todopoderoso.

La primera lectura de hoy nos muestra a otro tipo de Dios. Cuando David admite su pecado, Natán declara: "El Señor te perdona tu pecado" (2 Samuel 12:13b). Aquí no hay un Dios vengativo sino un Dios misericordioso. ¡Qué buena nueva debe haber sido eso para David y para los que, como él, eran lo suficientemente honestos como para admitir su pecado!

Jesús es la buena nueva de la misericordia y el perdón de Dios hecho carne. Sin Jesús, quizás la buena nueva hubiera sido demasiado buena como para creerla, demasiado difícil de imaginar. Pero allí está en el Evangelio de hoy, el Dios-hombre, perdonando a una pecadora y declarando que está perdonada debido a su gran amor.
