OUR RESPONSIBILITY FOR OTHERS

The Second Vatican Council has called us to envision the Church as the people of God. As a community of believers we are responsible for our brothers and sisters, their salvation, their journey of faith, their physical well-being. Many of the documents of Vatican II and volumes of work since the mid-1960s give us advice, guidelines, and encouragement to take care of one another: the poor, the elderly, the unborn, the broken, the infirm.

Because Vatican II is part of our recent history—indeed many of us were already born—this may strike us as a new and revolutionary idea. But today's readings show us the agelessness of the issue of social justice. Eight hundred years before Christ was born, Amos warned the wealthy not to cheat the poor. In Paul's first letter to Timothy, he encourages all prayers to be for all people; and finally, the Gospel urges the wise use of money.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Customs surrounding the naming of babies are interesting, and over time the Church has tried to offer some motherly advice to direct parents in this necessary chore. The ritual book used for baptism from the sixteenth to the mid-twentieth centuries advised priests to guard against giving ridiculous or pagan names to babies consigned to their ministry. In 1666 the diocesan ritual of Bourges in France was even more exacting, telling the priests to see to it that boys were named after male saints, girls after female saints, and no one got named after a festival. Yet, records from that very diocese in later years shows a few babies named "Toussaint" (after All Saints Day) along with other creative expressions. In Spain, no one has ever hesitated to name babies after festivals, especially girls after Our Lady, and so there are names like Concepción, Asunción, and of course Dolores (after Our Lady of Sorrows). In Italy and Spain is it likely that a child will receive the name of the saint of the day of its birth.

Today's rites of initiation for adults and infants urge the giving of a Christian name, and in the case of an adult whose given name expresses a pagan or unseemly idea (Baal and Whiskey come to mind), there is a formal rite during the catechumenate for the giving of a Christian name. In such a case, it would make sense for the change to be registered with civil authorities as well. For all Christians, the idea of having a heavenly patron to pray to on life's journey is reason enough to pay attention to this treasure in our tradition.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CENTER

We are making steady progress in repaying our Diocesan Loan which we incurred to complete the building of our Religious Education Center.

We began last fiscal year:

July 1 2015 with a balance due of \$933,756.43.

Through your pledges and our "Pink Envelope" contributions we have paid accumulated interest and reduced the loan as of August 1, 2016 to \$778,280.06. This reflects a reduction of \$155,476.37 in 14 months.

Prostate Cancer

September is Prostate Cancer Awareness Month. Because of the proximity of the prostate gland in relation to the bladder and urethra, prostate cancer may be accompanied by a variety of urinary symptoms. Depending on size and location, a tumor may press on and constrict the urethra, inhibiting the flow of urine. Some of the symptoms include:

- Burning and/or difficulty in urination.
- Frequency or loss of bladder control.
- Decreased flow or blood in the urine.

Vigésimo Quinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 18 de septiembre

SOMOS RESPONSABLES POR LOS DEMÁS

El Concilio Vaticano II nos ha llamado a imaginar la Iglesia como el pueblo de Dios. Como una comunidad de creyentes somos responsables por nuestros hermanos, por su salvación, su peregrinar en la fe, su bienestar físico. Muchos de los documentos del Concilio y volúmenes de trabajos desde mediados de la década del 60 nos dan consejos, guías y ánimo para ayudarnos unos a otros: a los pobres, a los ancianos, a los no nacidos, a los quebrantados, a los enfermos.

Porque el Concilio Vaticano II es parte de nuestra reciente historia –sin duda muchos de nosotros ya habíamos nacido– esto nos puede parecer una idea nueva y revolucionaria. Pero las lecturas de hoy nos muestran que las enseñanzas sobre justicia social han existido siempre. Ochocientos años antes de nacer Cristo, Amós advirtió a los ricos que no engañaran a los pobres. En la primera carta de Pablo a Timoteo, él insiste en que todas las oraciones sean por todos; y finalmente, el Evangelio enfatiza la importancia de usar sabiamente el dinero.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El santo Peruano Fray Juan Macías fue dominico. Este santo es reconocido como el amparo de los pobres, patrón de los emigrantes y ladrón del purgatorio. El concepto del purgatorio es un poco difícil de entender. La Iglesia adoptó la creencia en la última purificación de los elegidos (nombrado el Purgatorio) en los siglos XV y XVI en los concilios de Florencia y Trento. Ella se basa en las Escrituras que se refieren en la purificación en el fuego (1 Corintios 3:15; 1 Pedro 1:7) y en la práctica de la oración por los difuntos como aparece en 2 Macabeos 12:46 y Job 1:5. San Juan Crisóstomo dijo: “Si los hijos de Job fueron purificados por el sacrificio de su padre, ¿porqué vamos a dudar que nuestras oraciones por los difuntos puedan hacerle llegar alguna consolación a los que han muerto? Ofrezcamos pues, nuestras oraciones por los difuntos. Los que están en purgación necesitan nuestro apoyo en la oración. Pidamos por ellos”.

LECTURAS DE HOY

Primera lectura — El Señor nunca se olvida del pecado de los que hacen trampa a los pobres y abusan de ellos (Amós 8:4-7).

Salmo — Que alaben al Señor todos sus siervos (Salmo 113 [112]).

Segunda lectura — Reza al Señor, que quiere que todos se salven (1 Timoteo 2:1-8).

Evangelio — Sé responsable en todo. No pueden ustedes servir a Dios y al dinero (Lucas 16:1-13).

LA FUENTE BAPTISMAL

En la fuente bautismal, la Madre Iglesia da a luz a sus hijos y los sumerge por primera vez en las aguas del misterio pascual de Cristo. Así pues, este lugar debe ser destacado, de modo que en todo el Año Jubilar pueda ser referencia constante a la dignidad de hijos de Dios, a la cual el Padre mismo nos ha elevado. Sea lugar—memorial de las vestiduras blancas del Bautismo con las cuales todo cristiano ha sido revestido el día de su renacimiento. Recuerde también el “anillo” de la dignidad real con el cual todo confirmado ha sido provisto, por la acción del Espíritu Santo. No se olviden de las “sandalias” del profeta, el cual, tocado en los oídos y en la boca por el carbón ardiente de la misericordia de Dios, está llamado a anunciar la bondad del Padre y su paciencia con respecto al hombre y a su pecado.

La decoración más representativa de la fuente es, sin duda, la luz (no faltará, junto a la fuente, el candelabro con el cirio pascual en los tiempos del Año Litúrgico en los que está previsto este signo, incluso cuando la fuente no sea utilizada), además de las flores que remiten a la vida y al renacimiento. La fuente debe ser accesible y fácilmente identificable por los fieles, incluso cuando no es utilizada.
