## FREE BLOOD PRESSUE SCREENING

### **Sunday, April 2nd 8:30am-12:30pm**

These screenings are presented to the community to increase awareness and knowledge of prevention, detection and management of High blood pressure and are provided free by your Health Ministry Team. High blood pressure is often called "the silent killer" since it is possible to have the condition without any symptoms and left untreated can cause serious problems. Fortunately you can work with your doctor to control it. Drop by our free clinic and let our nurses help you monitor your blood pressure.

### JESUS' MINISTRY SUMMARIZED

The story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead is the single longest story (apart from the Passion) in the Gospel of John. In it we find a summary of most of Jesus' ministry. We see his very human nature as he is moved by Martha and Mary's sorrows and as he himself weeps at the tomb of Lazarus. He is the wisdom of God's Word made flesh as he explains to his followers that the death of Lazarus will serve as a sign of the glory of God. He crowns the miracles he works in John's Gospel (which began with the most "human" miracle of making new wine at Cana's wedding) by raising Lazarus from the dead—a "preview," if you will, of his own death and resurrection to come.

This portrait of Jesus reminds us, as we near the end of our Lenten journey, that he is with us, knows us, understands us in every moment of our lives. He knows the joy of our human feasting, he knows the sorrow of our weeping. As we prepare to walk with him through the days of Holy Week, we are filled with faith that—through Christ—God's glory will be with us in every moment of our lives and—with Christ—in our life everlasting.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Not until the thirteenth century do we find a mention of a locked tabernacle. There's some evidence for eucharistic towers also, but often these were in an obscure corner of the church, or even in the off-limits sacristy. Many of us grew up "making visits" to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, but it's clear this would raise some medieval eyebrows in confusion! To the present day, the Eucharist is always reserved only in a side chapel in many cathedrals. The principal focus in a cathedral is always on the altar, symbol of Christ, and on the cathedra, symbol of the pastoral ministry of the bishop.

In your parish church there is probably a "sanctuary lamp," a permanently lit candle or oil lamp indicating the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Sometimes it's in a red glass, not for any particular reason except that it's easy to find. There is a story of a bishop missioned to Papua New Guinea who was distressed to find no sanctuary lamps burning in his new diocese. The people patiently explained that their churches were woven of grass, and that they decided to place a chief's standard, a trident, in front of the tabernacle. That was a sign in their culture that the "chief" was at home, like raising the flag over Buckingham Palace.

The bishop, an Irish import, didn't appreciate the British reference, so he ordered the candles back. The first church to burn to the ground was the cathedral, and after two more, the chief's tridents returned.

### RESUMEN DEL MINISTERIO DE JESUS

El relato de cómo Lázaro revivió de entre los muertos es el relato más largo (además de la Pasión) en el Evangelio según san Juan. En él encontramos un resumen de la mayor parte del ministerio de Jesús. Vemos su naturaleza humana cuando se conmueve con la tristeza de Marta y de María y cuando él mismo llora frente a la tumba de Lázaro. Es la sabiduría de la Palabra de Dios hecha carne cuando le explica a sus seguidores que la muerte de Lázaro servirá como una señal de la gloria de Dios. Corona los milagros que obra en el Evangelio según san Juan (que comenzó con el milagro más "humano" de hacer más vino en la boda de Caná) reviviendo a Lázaro de entre los muertos; un "avance", por así decirlo, de su propia muerte y resurrección por venir. ### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Vicente Ferrer, patrón de los obreros de la construcción, falleció el 5 de abril de 1419. Este santo varón nació en Valencia, España, en 1350, vivió y predicó el Evangelio en una época muy difícil del cristianismo. Además de la peste, guerras y otros problemas sociales, la Iglesia estaba dividida por dos o tres hombres que insistían ser el verdadero Papa.

Vicente, un religioso dominico, dedicó su vida a reconstruir la Iglesia promoviendo la virtud de la caridad interna y externa mediante una predicación que relacionaba la Palabra de Dios con la vida cotidiana. Vicente se valía de la teología, poesía, repetición y otros medios para inculcar la sabiduría bíblica en sus oyentes. De esta manera supo construir la fe tanto en los fieles y en la Iglesia como comunidad.

Los cuadros de este santo español normalmente lo presentan con una llama ardiente en una mano y en la otra, con una Biblia abierta. De esta manera los artistas subrayan el amor ardiente que los cristianos debemos tener por la Palabra de Dios, un amor que Vicente edificaba en el corazón de los fieles.

### SIGNIFICADO DE LA RESURRECCIÓN

Con la Resurrección de Jesús, Dios afirma cosas muy importantes: Dios estaba de parte de Jesús, le da la razón en todo lo que hizo y dijo y se la quita a quienes estaban en su contra. -Rehabilita su causa y su persona: Jesús es su Hijo, el Cristo, el Mesías esperado. -Dice a la Iglesia naciente que su misión está fundada no solamente en el hecho histórico, sino en la experiencia pascual, en el encuentro de cada cristiano con Jesús Resucitado. -Es la anticipación de la meta de la historia; hace surgir una fuerza dinámica e invita a un programa de vida para cada hombre. -Hay un nuevo horizonte para la vida y nuevo sentido para la muerte. -La vida es un camino que se puede andar con esperanza, pues la muerte no es el fin del hombre, sino el medio para volver a su destino final: Dios Padre.

**EL ENCUENTRO DEL HOMBRE CON EL RESUCITADO:** Los Evangelios describen varios "encuentros" de Jesús Resucitado con varios de sus discípulos; hay cosas en común en estas experiencias: -Jesús se "deja ver", para que salgan de su incredulidad y de su desconcierto. -El encuentro afecta a la totalidad de sus personas: transforma el miedo en celo por el Evangelio; la ignorancia por sabiduría; la debilidad por fortaleza; la tristeza por alegría. (Gal 1,23). -Les descubre los enigmas de la fe: "se les abren los ojos" "ven y creen". -Los encuentros siempre conducen a una llamada a la evangelización "vayan y digan" (Mt 28, 18-20; Mc 16,15; Lc 24,28; Jn 20,21). -Comprenden que deben vivir su vida cotidiana con otro sentido y otra profundidad, el encuentro con el Resucitado es una experiencia prolongada en la vida. (2Cor 4,10).
