FORGIVENESS

Nearly ten years before, a son and father had parted ways when the business they shared went bankrupt. The son blamed the father. They did not speak to each other again.

Then the father became seriously ill. The mother called the son and told him he had better come soon. The son walked sheepishly into the hospital room. The father motioned his son to him and whispered: "Did you ever think you could do anything that would keep me from loving you?"

Resentment and anger are foul things, the first reading from Sirach tells us. Remember the last things. Stop hating. Live by the commandments. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, we are to live for the Lord and die for the Lord.

Jesus' parable in today's Gospel reminds us of God's compassion. The immense sin of humanity has been forgiven and stricken from the record. We are to forgive others in the same way.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

We've seen how the rescue of Eucharistic Prayer II from the mists of history changed the style of our prayer, introducing a sleek simplicity to the prayer said aloud by the priest. Remember, before the reform of our prayer in the late 1960s, the priest whispered the words of the Roman Canon, Eucharistic Prayer I. His voice was not amplified, his back was to the people, who could only tell what was going on by a shift in his posture as he bowed and genuflected and as bells were rung to indicate his progress through the prayer.

With the emergence of the new prayers, some feared that the old prayer would be lost forever if it weren't somehow changed. The reformers asked that it be streamlined a bit by omitting the repeated "Through Christ" at the end of various intercessions, and trimming the list of somewhat obscure saints. The new edition therefore brackets parts of the two lists of saints in the prayer, unfortunately dropping all the women from the second set. The decision was also made to keep the Lord's words at the consecration exactly the same in every Eucharistic Prayer, although there is precedent for more variety. On November 2, 1968, Pope Paul VI signed off on the plan of the new Mass, and by April 1969, the publication of the revised order of Mass was announced.

SEPTEMBER REFLECTION.....FATIMA

The 5th Apparition: "Fatima in Lucia's Own Words"

As the hour approached, I set out with Jacinta and Francisco, but owing to the crowds around us we could only advance with difficulty. The roads were packed with people, and everyone wanted to see us and speak to us. There was no human respect whatsoever. Simple folk, and even ladies and gentlemen, struggled to break through the crowd that pressed around us. No sooner had they reached us than they threw themselves on their knees before us, begging us to place their petitions before Our Lady. Others who could not get close to us shouted from a distance.

"For the love of God, ask Our Lady to cure my son who is a cripple!" Yet another cried out: "And to cure mine who is blind!"...To cure mine who is deaf!...To bring back my husband, my son, who has gone to war!..To convert a sinner!...To give me back my health as I have tuberculosis!".....and so on.

All the afflictions of poor humanity were assembled there. Some climbed up to the top of trees and walls to see us go by, and shouted down to us. Saying yes to some, giving a hand to others and helping them up from the dusty ground, we managed to move forward, thanks to some gentlemen who went ahead and opened a passage for us through the multitude.....

HEALTH MINISTRY

September is **Prostate Cancer Month** and St. Paul Health Ministry encourages you to learn enough about the subject to make informed decisions about how to maintain your health. Some men are more at risk than others. African-American men are nearly twice as likely to develop the disease. A diet high in saturated fats increases the risk. Men who use testosterone therapy are at a higher risk.

Often prostate cancer is found before there are any symptoms, but are reluctant to talk about them. There are a couple of minimally invasive tests that can be performed by your doctor—a simple blood test and a physical exam.

Testing should start on the average about 50 years of age. African American men should start a few years earlier. Talk to your doctor. Be informed!

SOMOS RESPONSABLES POR LOS DEMAS

El Concilio Vaticano II nos ha llamado a imaginar la Iglesia como el pueblo de Dios. TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El santo Peruano Fray Juan Macías fue dominico. Este santo es reconocido como el amparo de los pobres, patrón de los emigrantes y ladrón del purgatorio. El concepto del purgatorio es un poco difícil de entender. La Iglesia adoptó la creencia en la última purificación de los elegidos (nombrado el Purgatorio) en los siglos XV y XVI en los concilios de Florencia y Trento. Ella se basa en las Escrituras que se refieren en la purificación en el fuego (1 Corintios 3:15; 1 Pedro 1:7) y en la práctica de la oración por los difuntos como aparece en 2 Macabeos 12:46 y Job 1:5. San Juan Crisóstomo dijo: "Si los hijos de Job fueron purificados por el sacrificio de su padre, ¿porqué vamos a dudar que nuestras oraciones por los difuntos puedan hacerle llegar alguna consolación a los que han muerto? Ofrezcamos pues, nuestras oraciones por los difuntos. Los que están en purgación necesitan nuestro apoyo en la oración. Pidamos por ellos".

EL AMOR A NUESTROS ENEMIGOS

Lucas 6, 27-38

En aquel tiempo dijo Jesús a sus discípulos: - A los que me escucháis yo os digo: Amad a vuestros enemigos, haced bien a los que os odian, bendecid a los que os maldigan, rogad por los que os difamen. Al que te hiera en una mejilla, preséntale también la otra; y al que te quite el manto, no le niegues la túnica. A todo el que te pida, da, y al que tome lo tuyo, no se lo reclames. Y lo que queráis que os hagan los hombres, hacédselo vosotros igualmente. Si amáis a los que os aman, ¿qué mérito tenéis? Pues también los pecadores aman a los que les aman. Si hacéis bien a los que os lo hacen a vosotros, ¿qué mérito tenéis? ¡También los pecadores hacen otro tanto! Si prestáis a aquellos de quienes esperaréis recibir, ¿qué mérito tenéis? También los pecadores prestan a los pecadores para recibir lo correspondiente. Más bien, amad a vuestros enemigos; haced el bien, y prestad sin esperar nada a cambio; y vuestra recompensa será grande, y seréis hijos del Altísimo, porque él es bueno con los ingratos y los perversos. Sed compasivos, como vuestro Padre es compasivo. No juzguéis y no seréis juzgados, no condenéis y no seréis condenados; perdonad y seréis perdonados. Dad y se os dará; una medida generosa, colmada, rebosante. Porque con la medida con que midáis se os medirá.

En cierta ocasión surgió un altercado entre dos hombres, y comenzaron a discutir.
