Twenty seventh Sunday In Ordinary Time

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.

— Philippians 4:6

BEARING THE RIGHT KIND OF FRUIT

Today's readings focus our attention on vineyards. Isaiah's song concerning his friend's vineyard begins with inspiring and poetic images of an idyllic vineyard where the choicest harvest is expected. Instead, the vineyard yields wild grapes, which causes the owner to abandon it. The psalmist cries out to God, asking that God once again take care of the vineyard, which is the house of Israel. The parable told in today's Gospel offers a stern warning that those who commit treachery in the hopes of attaining personal wealth will be "put . . . to a wretched death" (Matthew 21:41). Jesus warns his listeners not to act like the murderous tenants in the vineyard. Instead he exhorts them to produce the kind of fruit that will lead them to the kingdom of God.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Before long, as we've seen, the four newly constructed Eucharistic Prayers became two. The old Roman Canon faded away into relative disuse after 1600 unbroken years, sometimes heard only at Christmas Midnight Mass or the Easter Vigil. The new Eucharistic Prayer IV, at least in its English form, grates a bit on most hearers, and besides is meant only for Ordinary Time. The reconstruction of the ancient prayer of Hippolytus, Eucharistic Prayer II, is the most familiar, but its brevity sometimes creates an imbalance with the Liturgy of the Word. No wonder that as soon as the creative juices began to flow at the Vatican, people worldwide were trying their hands at new prayers.

In 1967, even before the final shape of the new Mass was announced, bishops were asking to adapt that celebration for the needs of children. They wanted to clarify what ought to happen when large numbers of children are at Mass: what could be adapted, omitted, or shortened. Experimentation had already begun. Separate Liturgies of the Word for children were by this time commonplace in Holland and elsewhere in Europe. Catechists were saying that many of our liturgical forms were too complex for the children in their charge, and priests were making adaptations on their own. Clearly, the Vatican had to take this seriously.

El cántico de Isaías respecto a la viña de su amada comienza con inspiradoras y poéticas imágenes de una idílica viña de la cual se espera la más exquisita cosecha. En cambio, la viña da uvas agrias, lo cual hace que el dueño la abandone. El salmista clama a Dios, pidiéndole que la visite otra vez, ya que es la casa de Israel. La parábola que cuenta hoy el Evangelio ofrece la seria advertencia de que a los que cometen traición esperando obtener ganancia personal se les “dará muerte terrible” (Mateo 21:41). Jesús advierte a sus oyentes que no actúen como los viñadores asesinos en la viña. Más bien los exhorta a que produzcan el tipo de fruto que los llevará al Reino de Dios.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La Virgen María tiene siglos de estar apareciéndose a los cristianos. Aún antes de que fuese asunta al cielo, ella ya se le había aparecido al apóstol Santiago en Zaragoza, España. Según una antigua leyenda, Santiago llegó a tierra española en el año 40 para predicar el Evangelio. Tuvo poco éxito y desanimado pensaba sacudirse de los pies el polvo de aquella tierra y buscar convertir otras gentes. Mientras estaba en oración, María, la madre de Jesús, se le apareció con palabras de consuelo, ánimo y un pequeño obsequio. Le dio una imagen de ella misma sobre un pilar y con el Niño Jesús en brazos.

En esa tierra ella pidió la construcción de un templo donde ella misma sería altar para la gloria de Dios. Santiago mismo construyó la primera iglesia donde hoy se encuentra una gran basílica en honor de Nuestra Señora del Pilar. En el siglo XVIII, el Papa Clemente XII declaró el 12 de octubre como su fiesta en memoria de la llegada de los europeos al continente americano. De María vienen los principios del Día de la Raza.

MEDITEMOS

Siguiendo el catecismo de la Iglesia podemos decir que los ángeles son seres espirituales creados por Dios. Son seres inmortales, dotados de inteligencia y voluntad. La misión de los ángeles es amar, servir y dar gloria a Dios, ser mensajeros, cuidar y ayudar a los hombres. Ellos están constantemente en la presencia de Dios, atentos a sus órdenes, orando, adorando, vigilando, cantando, alabando a Dios y pregonando sus perfecciones. Se puede decir que son mediadores, custodios, guardianes, protectores y ministros de la justicia divina.

Arcángel San Miguel: es el que arrojó del Cielo a Lucifer y a los ángeles que le seguían y quien mantiene la batalla contra Satanás y demás demonios para destruir su poder y ayudar a la Iglesia militante a obtener la victoria final. El nombre de Miguel significa “quien como Dios”. Su conducta y fidelidad nos debe invitar a reconocer siempre el señorío a Jesús y buscar en todo momento la gloria de Dios.

Arcángel San Gabriel: en hebreo significa “Dios es fuerte”, “Fortaleza de Dios”. Aparece siempre como el mensajero de Yahvé para cumplir misiones especiales y como portador de buenas noticias. Anunció a Zacarías el nacimiento de Juan, el Bautista y a la Virgen María, la Encarnación del Hijo de Dios.

Arcángel San Rafael: su nombre quiere decir “medicina de Dios”. Tiene un papel muy importante en la vida del profeta Tobías, al mostrarle el camino a seguir y lo que tenía que hacer. Tobías obedeció en todo al arcángel San Rafael, sin saber que era un mensajero de Dios. Él se encargó de presentar sus oraciones y obras buenas a Dios, dejándole como mensaje bendecir y alabar al Señor, hacer siempre el bien y no dejar de orar. Se le considera patrono de los viajeros por haber guiado a Tobías en sus viajes. Es patrono, también, de los médicos (de cuerpo y alma) por las curaciones que realizó en Tobit y Sara, el padre y la esposa de Tobías. encomiéndate a tu Ángel de la guardia para que te ayude a aspirar a los bienes de arriba
