### Second Sunday of Easter (or Sunday of Divine Mercy) April 8, 2018

Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?— 1 John 5:5

### SO THAT YOU MAY BELIEVE

It is not often that the author of one of the books of the Bible comes right out and tells us directly why he is writing what he is writing. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, taken from the conclusion of John's Gospel, the author tells us that he has chosen to record these events so "that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name" (20:31).

The letter of John echoes this idea by saying that "[e]veryone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God" (5:1)—what we might refer to as being "born again." Our reading from the Acts of the Apostles for this Second Sunday of Easter shows us exactly what it looks like when believers are born again through faith.

### TREASURES OF OUR TRADITIONS

Sometimes children acquire nicknames in childhood that stalk them through adulthood: "Pinky," "Boo-boo," and the like. This Sunday was once called "Low Sunday," a step down from Easter glory, and an unfortunate nickname since Easter rejoicing goes on for fifty days. Traditionally this is the day when the newly baptized put away their white baptismal robes and returned to their everyday life after a week of intense celebration. Of course, the goal was to take up everyday duties with a very new point of view.

A long title for the day was *Dominica in albis deposita*, or "The Lord's Day for Putting Away the Albs," so no wonder the nickname "Low Sunday" arose. In the old calendar it was also called "Quasimodo Sunday," after the first word of the opening chant, *Quasimodo geniti infantes*, or "As newborn infants," a reference to the newly baptized taken from the Epistle of Peter. Victor Hugo's bell-ringing hero in *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* was abandoned as an infant on the threshold of the cathedral of Paris on Low Sunday, 1467, and named "Quasimodo" for the feast.

## PARA QUE CREAS

No sucede demasiado a menudo que el autor de uno de los libros de la Biblia se dirija directamente a nosotros para explicarnos por qué está escribiendo lo que está escribiendo. En la lectura del Evangelio de este domingo, que pertenece a la conclusión del Evangelio según san Juan, el autor nos dice que ha elegido escribir estos acontecimientos para que “crean que Jesús es el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios, y para que, creyendo, tengan vida en su Nombre” (20:31).

La carta de san Juan retoma esta idea diciendo que: “todo el que cree que Jesús es el Cristo ha nacido de Dios” (5:1); lo que llamaríamos “nacer de nuevo”. Nuestra lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles para este Segundo Domingo de Pascua nos muestra exactamente qué sucede cuando los creyentes nacen de nuevo por medio de la fe.

## LECTURAS DE HOY

**Primera lectura** — La comunidad de los creyentes compartía todo con el mismo amor (Hechos 4:32-35).

**Salmo** — Den gracias al Señor porque es bueno, porque es eterna su misericordia (Salmo 118 [117]).

## TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En tiempos pasados, cuando la Misa era en latín, no teníamos la oportunidad de escuchar en nuestra propia lengua las bellas palabras que Cristo pronunció durante la Última Cena y que el sacerdote repite durante la Consagración: “Esto es mi cuerpo”. . . “Esta es mi sangre”. Por tal razón los monaguillos sonaban unas campanitas indicando que algo importante estaba pasando. En ese momento los fieles levantábamos la cabeza para ver el pan convertido en cuerpo y el vino convertido en sangre. Lamentablemente el sacerdote nos daba la espalda y no podíamos ver lo que ocurría sobre el altar. Sin embargo, respondíamos con las palabras del apóstol Tomás: “Señor mío y Dios mío”.

Estas palabras reconocen y adoran la presencia de Jesús en el pan y el vino. A este momento se le consideraba el más importante de la Misa. No obstante, el Concilio Vaticano II vino a enseñarnos que este es el momento cumbre, junto con toda la Plegaria Eucarística, pues toda la Misa es igualmente importante, excepto que durante la Plegaria Eucarística alcanzamos el punto más alto de la celebración. Por esa razón ya no hay campanita, pues ahora escuchamos todo en nuestro propio idioma, así como los discípulos las escucharon de Cristo, en su propio idioma.

## 10 APARICIONES DE CRISTO RESUCITADO

Los primeros creyentes no hallaban mejor modo de describirlo que llamarlo, “Rey de reyes y Señor de Señores,” en verdad, Dios mismo. Inalterablemente monoteístas, ellos se sentían justificados al hacer esto porque Jesús había dicho tales cosas él mismo y el único Jesús que ellos recordaban era el Jesús que les enseñó con autoridad absoluta, como jamás nunca algún hombre había hablado. La historia de Jesús es sobrenatural desde el principio hasta el fin. La historia tiene en abundancia a Dios, a ángeles, a demonios, a Satanás, eventos milagrosos, saneamientos divinos, al Espíritu Santo, y a la dimensión eterna penetrando el tiempo. El material mismo de los cuatro Evangelios consiste de muchos eventos singulares en la vida de Jesús, tal como el nacimiento de virgen, su transfiguración, su resurrección de los muertos, y su ascensión al cielo. Estos no son mitos antiguos, sino realidades históricas, lo cimentada en la que la fe Cristiana está fundada. Quítale estas cosas y ya no queda fe Cristiana. La historia de Jesús nos dice que la muerte en realidad no es el fin...Sino tal como Jesús rompió el poder de la sepultura, así el poder la muerte sobre nosotros será quebrantada al creer en él. Él dijo [a Marta], “Yo soy la resurrección y la vida; el que cree en mí, aunque esté muerto, vivirá. Y todo aquel que vive y cree en mí, no morirá eternamente” (Juan 11:25-26). Estas son palabras extraordinarias, pero esa es la promesa. Porque Jesús vive, aquellos que confían en él vivirán para siempre con él. Finalmente, todo lo mencionado arriba es cierto porque el punto final es cierto – que Jesús está vivo y promete estar con nosotros ahora y hasta el fin del mundo...El mismo Jesús que anduvo en las playas de Galilea, que sanó a los enfermos de sus enfermedades y perdonó a los pecadores sus transgresiones su palabra dice: “Así está escrito, y así fue necesario que el Cristo padeciese, y resucitase de los muertos al tercer día” (Lucas 24:46).
