### AUTHORITY FROM GOD

According to Moses, the people decided they didn't want to hear God's voice directly any more. It was much too frightening. Why couldn't God send human teachers, prophets, instead? God agreed, but with a warning. The people had better listen to those teachers, because they spoke in God's name.

That arrangement, though, had its own problems, for them and for us. How do I know this teacher is truly from God? And if the teacher is from God, are all parts of the teaching meant for me? We have the Church and scripture to help us with those questions, but still there are always a few loose ends.

That is the powerful significance of the sentence in today's Gospel: "The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." The people knew that this Jesus was authentic—truly a teacher sent by God. They knew it by hearing him.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Oil of the Sick, usually labeled OI (for *Oleum Infirmarum*), is often reserved with chrism and the oil of catechumens in an ambry. An ambry is a cabinet, often beautifully ornamented and kept near the baptistery in the church. Olive oil, with no fragrance added, is blessed at the Chrism Mass in Holy Week by the bishop, although there is now a provision for a priest to bless oil if none is available. This restores to our Latin Rite practice a tradition never lost in the Eastern tradition, in which priests consecrate the oil of the sick, even at the sick person's home. Any vegetable oil may be used now, since olive oil is difficult to obtain in some places. Many priests keep a small supply of oil close at hand in a small metal tube called a "stock."

In the former rite, every sense of the body was anointed, accompanied by a prayer for forgiveness of sin. So, the eyes, ears, nostrils, mouth, hands, and feet were all touched. Today, this is simplified to an anointing of the forehead and the hands, but generally today the oil is used more lavishly, and the symbolism of touch so central to the rite is enhanced. Often, a priest will invite everyone present to join in the "laying on of hands." Sick persons are often pushed aside or feared in our culture, and to be reverently touched in love can be a profound experience of God's healing, forgiving, accepting presence through the ministry of the Church.

## CELEBRATE BLACK HISTORY

### Black African in Religion

**Sister Josephine Bakhita**, a black African slave from Sudan, who became a member of the Canossian Daughters of Charity, was canonized on October 1, 2000 in Rome by Pope John Paul II. During the canonization Mass, the Pope said Sr. Josephine Bakhita, a one-time slave, could become a model of “genuine emancipation,” for the many women who continue to be victimized in modern society. The history of her life inspires not passive acceptance, but the firm resolve to work effectively to free girls and women from oppression and violence, and to return them to their dignity in the full exercise of their rights.

Sister Josephine Bakhita was born in 1869 in Olgossa, a village in Darfur, Sudan, to a prosperous family. In 1876, at the age of 7, she was kidnapped, and sold as a slave more than once until 1883, when she was sold to Callisto Legnani, the Italian Consul to Africa. In 1885, when Legnani was leaving Africa for Italy Bakhita asked for and received permission to go with him. Legnani gave Josephine to Augusto Micheili, a rich businessman from Venice, who took her with him to his Villa, where for 3 years she served as nursemaid to his daughter, Alice.

In 1890, Bakhita was baptized, confirmed and received the Eucharist at the hands of the patriarch Cardinal Agostini. She entered the Canossian novitiate in 1893 and made her religious profession in 1896 in Verona. She served for 45 years in the Canossian Community at Schio as a cook, embroiderer, sacristan and portress. Bakhita was also known for her ministry with children in the Canossian sisters’ School, sharing with them African songs. She gained the sympathy and esteem of all of the town’s inhabitants, who called her affectionately, “Madre Moretta,” (black mother). She died in 1947. The Canossian Sisters first came to serve in the Sacramento Diocese at St Joseph Parish in Lincoln.

## Cuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 1 de febrero de 2015

### AUTORIDAD DE DEUS

De acuerdo a Moisés, el pueblo decidió que no quería ya más oír la voz directa de Dios. Era demasiado aterradora. ¿Por qué no les podía Dios enviar a maestros o profetas humanos? Dios aceptó pero con una advertencia. El pueblo debía escuchar a estos maestros, puesto que hablaban en nombre de Dios.

Ese acuerdo, sin embargo, resultó en otros problemas, para ellos y para nosotros. ¿Cómo sé si este maestro es en realidad de Dios? Y si el maestro es de Dios, ¿están todas las partes de su enseñanza dirigidas a mí? Tenemos la Iglesia y la Sagrada Escritura para ayudarnos con todas estas preguntas, pero así y todo siempre quedan algunos cabos sueltos.

Ese es el poderoso significado de la frase en el Evangelio de hoy: "Los oyentes quedaron asombrados de sus palabras, pues enseñaba como quien tiene autoridad y no como los escribas". El pueblo sabía que este Jesús era auténtico -verdaderamente un maestro enviado por Dios. Lo sabían con sólo escucharle.

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Muchos católicos suelen encender una velita de cera ante una imagen de Jesús, María u otro santo. Esa velita representa un recuerdo de la oración hecha por el cristiano y suele quedarse encendida varios días. Hoy, muchos templos han reemplazado la vela de cera con luces eléctricas que imitan el fuego de la velita. A muchos no les gusta y se resisten al concepto. No los culpo, ya que hay algo muy especial en la acción ritual de encender una vela. Sin embargo, hay que recordar que lo importante es la oración y no la velita. Hoy se enciende la vela eléctrica, en tiempos pasados la vela de cera, pero en el primer milenio cristiano se encendía una lámpara de aceite de olivo. Según la historia pasaron varios siglos antes de que la Iglesia aceptara la vela de cera en lugar de la de aceite. Los cristianos del siglo XIII se negaban a aceptar lo que hoy consideramos tradicional, la vela de cera. Hay que aceptar que nuestras tradiciones cambian al correr del tiempo. No importa si quemamos aceite, cera o electricidad. Lo que importa es velar en oración.

### LECTURAS DE HOY

**Primera lectura** — Moisés le habló a todo el pueblo diciendo: "El Señor Dios hará surgir en medio de ustedes un profeta como yo" (Deuteronomio 18:15-20).

**Salmo** — Ojalá escuchen hoy su voz; no endurezcan sus corazones (Salmo 95 [94]).

**Segunda lectura** — Hermanos y hermanas: Yo quisiera que ustedes vivieran sin preocupaciones (1 Corintios 7:32-35).

**Evangelio** — Los oyentes quedaron asombrados de sus palabras, pues enseñaba como quien tiene autoridad (Marcos 1:21-28).

### LA CLAVE DE LA LUZ

Dios ha creado el mundo con la Palabra y, por eso, la materia no es extraña a la inteligencia. En la materia del mundo se esconde su sentido, porque la Palabra, el Logos, es sentido, la orientación, la dirección, la jerarquía justa de las cosas. Hay un código del Logos puesto en la materia de todo el universo, y Dios es tan bueno que nos ha dejado también la clave de lectura. Esa clave es la luz. En efecto, al principio Dios creo la luz. El mundo se entiende solo en la luz. Las cosas, los objetos, la naturaleza y el mismo hombre se entienden sólo con el trasfondo de la luz. Más aun, a la luz. Pero el hombre no puede mirar la luz. Sería demasiado. La fuente de la luz queda detrás, más allá. Aquí están los colores. La experiencia de la luz es la fiesta de los colores. Dice Gregoria de Nisa: "Al igual que, de hecho, el resplandor del fuego estaba escondido aparentemente bajos partículas de la materia, del mismo modo las lascas permanecen oscuras en las tinieblas, aunque contengan en sí, naturalmente, una fuerza luminosa, pues producen el fuego si se golpea una contra otra, cuando generan una críspas, también ellas se aclaran: así, todas las cosas eran invisibles y oscuras antes de que la esencia clarificadora se manifestara avanzando... Y esto se hizo gracias a la potencia de Aquel que la ha creado, así como recuerda a Moisés la palabra imperativa de Dios: *Hágase la Luz y la luz se hizo*. De hecho, en Dios, según nuestro entendimiento, la obra en la palabra. Y cualquier cosa que nazca de él nace por la palabra".
