GOD'S WORK OF SALVATION

God's work of salvation is the focus of this weekend's readings. From the prophetic event of Isaiah to Jesus' understanding of the human condition in Hebrews, concluding with Jesus paying our ransom in Mark, God is in control. There may be failings and misunderstandings along the way. We may move away from God, but at our conversion, God leads us back. Like James and John, we may let greed and power blur our vision of what Jesus wants us to know about the Kingdom; but tirelessly we are taught and re-taught what life in the Kingdom will be. Jesus has paid our ransom to ensure that we will share in the Kingdom.

It is not unusual to think of Jesus' ransom as a punishment that he endured. However, it is more accurate, and more like Jesus, for us to recognize ransom as God's gift to us.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

The Irish are rightly tired of being the subject of jokes about guilt. In fact, it is from the Celtic church that the whole experience of reconciliation in our tradition was creatively rescued and revived. The Irish church was unique in its origins, not so much organized around dioceses, but around monasteries. Aspects of religious community life readily spilled over into ordinary gatherings of the faithful, including the way people looked at sin and applied remedies. Unlike the public nature of canonical penance, the Irish method was linked to a kind of mentoring process they called "soul friending." Just as young novice monks might find a mentor in the wisdom of a senior guide, so did a way of penance open up to ordinary folks. Monks were accustomed to frequent confession of faults to the abbot or mentor, who would suggest penances. In time, abbots with a certain flair for this began to share lists of sins and corresponding "tariffs" with others. Some of these books survive, and provide a hair-raising view of long-ago sins like cattle rustling, and a great deal of self-correction involving dips in icy streams and rolling about in thickets of thorns. After the penance was performed, the penitent returned to the confessor, and in a private act marked by the laying on of hands, or perhaps a kiss of the altar, the sinner was restored.

Irish monks were committed travelers, and their methods were widely copied. We might say that they saved a sacrament, but at the expense of shifting attention to the sins of the individual and away from the actions of the reconciling community.

PARISH STEWARDSHIP

PASTORAL COUNCIL

The meeting opened with a prayer for the Pope's visit to the USA. Minutes were approved and corrections made.

The White Elephant Chairman for next year will meet with the Council and present a plan on the running of the event.

The Mr. & Miss St. Paul fundraiser is going well. First counting of tickets was October 3rd. A status report will be given at the next meeting.

The Fall Festival was a success, lower attendance than last year due to the heat. The financial report will be issued at the next meeting. The Pastoral Council will be chairing the Festival next year. Suggestion was made on moving the date to escape the heat a little. Entertainment and Horse Show will not be scheduled simultaneously next year. Need more Spanish entertainment.

The St. Lorenzo Mass wasn't well attended. A recommendation was made to research the cost of purchasing a statue of St. Lorenzo.

The Feasibility Study for the Diocesan and Parish Capital Campaign will be presented to the Finance Council in October.

Missalettes will no longer be purchased for the church, starting with Advent. Limited number of copies of the prayers for the Sunday Masses will be printed and placed in the pews.

Fr. Joyle will lead a 6 week Bible Study program beginning October 22nd. Classes start at 6:30pm. Call the office to register for the class.

Next meeting will be October 19th.

FUNDRAISER

Our parish is having a fundraiser to help offset some of the significant lessening amounts in our Sunday collections,

All proceeds are for general funds and general expenses, including the budgeted salary for our DRE and Youth Ministry Director, Sister Kathy.

The fundraiser is call "Mr. & Miss St. Paul 2015." There are 10 young adults, ages 13-22, who have volunteered to participate. They will sell ballot tickets (\$1.00) each, and the pair who sell the most will be crowned Mr. & Miss St. Paul 2015. The other eight candidates are winners also, they will be crowned as Mr & Miss Faith, Hope, Charity and Joy, according to the amount of ballots they sell.

A small percentage of the proceeds will be compensated to each candidate for their efforts.

The ballots are also raffle tickets, which will be drawn at the coronation on December 20th.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

is an ongoing, year round program for un-baptized adults (catechumens) and baptized adults who are seeking more information on the Catholic faith or Catholics who wish to complete the Sacraments of First Communion, Reconciliation and/or Confirmation.

INQUIRY CLASSES

The first stage is called the Period of Inquiry (or the pre-catechumenate). Classes usually last for 3-6 months and are for those in the initial stages of learning about the Catholic faith and/or those seeking more information about God and/or joining the Church. These sessions are informal and friends and spouses are welcome. They will last as long as the student needs to decide if they feel ready to move into the next stage.

CATECHUMENATE

The second stage is called the catechumenate. This is for catechumens (un-baptized) and candidates (baptized). The Rites of Acceptance and Welcoming mark the beginning of this time. Catechesis (learning about the Word of God thru the Lectionary, the Bible and the beliefs of the Church) is studied during this time and may take 1-2 years depending on the amount of adult faith formation the catechumen or candidate has. Each persons journey is unique and each person is allowed to progress at the rate the individual feels comfortable with. When they are ready to proceed further with their initiation the next stage begins.

PERIOD OF ENLIGHTENMENT AND PURIFICATION

This third stage is celebrated with the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion at the beginning of Lent and lasts for 40 days. During this time catechesis is not the primary focus of learning. It is a time of discernment and purification and preparation for a new life as a Christian. The Elect, as they are now called, have a time of intense preparation and prayer along with the celebrations of three public scrutinizes and a retreat in which to prepare for their Sacraments of Initiation at Easter Vigil. Initiation at Easter Vigil.

MYSTAGOGIA

The fourth and final stage is a period of exploring the experiences of the fully initiated Christians through the Sacraments, continuing catechesis and parish celebration. It is a time when the neophyte is welcomed into all aspects of the parish life and its service. This is usually 50 days or more depending on personal need. At the end of this time the new Christian begins the rest of their life long journey in full communion with the Church.

LA OBRA DIVINA DE SALVACIÓN

La obra de Dios de la salvación es el enfoque de las lecturas este fin de semana. Desde el acontecer profético de Isaías hasta la visión de Jesús sobre la condición humana en Hebreos, y terminando con el rescate que paga Jesús por nosotros en san Marcos, Dios está al mando. Puede que ocurran caídas e incomprensiones por el camino. Puede que nos alejemos de Dios, pero Dios nos trae de vuelta a su lado mediante la conversión. Al igual que Santiago y Juan, a veces dejamos que la avaricia y el poder empañen nuestra visión de lo que Jesús nos quiere enseñar sobre el Reino; pero sin tregua nos enseña y nos repite cómo ha de ser la vida en el Reino. Jesús ha pagado por nuestro rescate para garantizar que compartamos el Reino con él.

No es raro que pensemos sobre el rescate que pagó Jesús en términos de un castigo que tuvo que sufrir. Sin embargo, es más acertado y más como Jesús, reconocer

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Santiago y Juan, además de ser hermanos, eran tipos muy atrevidos. Se acercaron a Jesús para pedirle puestos de poder y autoridad en el Reino que estaba estableciendo. Al darse cuenta, los demás discípulos se molestaron con ellos, probablemente porque deseaban los mismos puestos. La tentación y el deseo de poder es algo muy común a todos los seres humanos. Todos deseamos el primer puesto y la estima de los demás. No obstante, Jesús nos recuerda que no es fácil tener responsabilidad. La autoridad es un cáliz difícil de beber ya que muchas veces contiene una bebida amarga y el peso o decisión de ser fieles al Evangelio, aún a costa de la propia vida.

Por tal motivo, la persona que quiera estar cerca de Jesús tendrá que aprender a ser como Cristo, quien no vino a imponer su autoridad buscando ser servido, sino que vino a servir. Él, siendo Dios, no se aferró a su condición divina, sino que se hizo uno de tantos, cuidando a su madre por muchos años, juntándose con pecadores, lavando los pies a sus discípulos y dando la vida por todas las personas. Estar al lado de Jesús no es cuestión de poder, sino de amor y servicio, hasta dar la vida. Él nos puso el ejemplo.

Segunda lectura — Porque tenemos un sumo sacerdote que ha sido probado en todo, a excepción del pecado, acerquémonos con plena confianza al Dios de bondad (Hebreos 4:14-16).

Evangelio — El Hijo del Hombre ha venido a servir y a dar su vida como rescate por una muchedumbre (Marcos 10:35-45).

APRENDIENDO

Pasos para la oración y la lectura con la Biblia:

- 1) Disponga tu interior y busca un momento de silencio que favorezca la oración.
- 2) Pida al Espíritu Santo que abra tu mente y corazón a la Palabra de Dios.
- 3) Lee el texto bíblico una vez, pero muy lentamente, lee las notas al pie de la página y el comentario que tiene la Biblia, pues te ayudarán a entender el texto.
- 4) Lee nuevamente el texto, pero esta vez hazlo más lentamente y en una actitud orante. Si el pasaje describe un relato o evento, usa tu imaginación para colocarte a ti mismo en medio de la escena como uno de los protagonistas o participantes. Haz una pausa en medio de cada frase, palabras o imágenes que te hablen al corazón y déjalas que resuenen en él. La primera lectura fue para tu mente. Pero esta es para el corazón.
- 5) Permanece en silencio: Deja que la Palabra de Dios siga resonando en tu alma, mente y corazón.
- 6) Ora con tus propias palabras. Agradécele a Dios por su Palabra y pídele la gracia necesaria para llevarla a la vida diaria.
- 7) Pide por tu familia, amigos, enfermos y especialmente por los niños.
