THE GREAT HYMN TO LOVE

It is doubtful that Saint Paul, when he sat down to write what we now know as the thirteenth chapter of First Corinthians, knew that he was penning what was to become one of the keystones of Christian ethics. In this brief passage, he set down ideals about love that have held fast through the centuries. Sometimes we may think that because these are ideals to which we aspire, we are excused from them in our daily living.

But what Paul was writing was a letter to his friends, providing them with some sound advice about what it meant—and still means—to live in love, day by day, as a follower of Christ. We find in his words to his friends a broadening of the great commands of Jesus to love God and neighbor. Today we hear what this love must look like in our own actions, and how it ought to guide our relationships with others.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

For the first four centuries or so, there seems not to have been a sense of marriage as a church institution. Christians followed civil law, which kept the wedding in a family setting. Bishops wanted people to be good citizens insofar as possible, and so they recognized the government's role in marriage. In general, they expected Christians to know that marriage was good, that marriage to other Christians was best, and to take it easy on the wild wedding parties. They agreed that marriage was a divine institution, that Christ blessed it especially, and they loved referring to the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana. Still, even when Christianity became the official religion of the empire in 380, marriage remained a family matter.

On wedding days people gathered in the bride's house, where the father would "give her hand" to her husband, draping a garland of flowers over the couple. There were no official words to say, there was no blessing to be given. Everyone walked in procession to the bride's new home for the concluding rites and the feast. In the Eastern Empire, it soon became customary to invite a priest or bishop to give a blessing at the meal or the day before. It was a nice thing to do, completely optional, but had a "photo-op" feel to it that was widely emulated. Before long, at least in the East, it looked as if the priest were joining the couple in marriage and blessing the union.

PASTORAL COUNCIL

The meeting was opened by Paul Pham at 7:10 pm. Minutes from the November meeting were approved after corrections were made. There was no meeting in December.

The Mr. and Miss St Paul fundraiser grossed \$57,778 and expenses were \$13,847. The event netted an astounding \$43,931! We thank the Mr and Miss St Paul Committee for their great effort. A special thank you to Edna Clegg for chairing the event. Also thanks to the candidates, their families and St. Paul community for their great support ; The Diocesan One Campaign and St Paul Campaign will be kicked off in mid-February 2016. The first phase is to form teams and committees to lead the combined campaign. It's anticipated the campaign will officially begin in April.

The Liturgy Committee recommended the current Order of the Mass cards be replaced with a smaller version. The Mass cards will be laminated, along with the other Prayer Cards, inserted into the existing Missal Covers. The Liturgy Committee will be responsible for coordinating Simbang Gabi this year.

A committee is researching a low-cost option to replace the song books with one that includes the seasonal songs and hymns.

A Lenten Retreat is being planned for the parish. More information will follow. Masses for Ash Wednesday, Feb 10 are. English at 8am, 12pm, 6pm and 7:30 pm for Spanish. Feast of St. Paul Mass and potluck is planned for January 25, 2016. Masses are at 8am and 6:30 pm bi-lingual. February 2, 2016 is the Feast of Candles Mass is at 8am and February 3, 2016 is St Blaze Day Mass is at 8am.

The Social Justice reported 350 pairs of socks, gloves, blankets, scarfs, and sleeping bags were given to Loaves and Fishes for the homeless.

Father Felipe's celebration for his 47 years as a Priest is scheduled for February 7, 2016.

Bishop Soto will be celebrating Holy Saturday at the 7am Mass at St Elizabeth. Bishop Cotta will be celebrating World Marriage Day Mass on February 13, 2016 at the Cathedral.

Sunday, after the Masses, people were invited to sign a Parental Notification petition. Over 150 signed the petition. If enough signatures are gathered on the petition throughout California, the issue would qualify for the 2016 ballot.

A girl under 18 cannot get a flu shot, or take an aspirin given to her by a school nurse without a parent knowing, but she can have a surgical or medical abortion without parental notification. This petition will require that a parent be notified at least 48 hours prior to an abortion on his or her daughter under the age of 18, (with a judicial bypass for cases of parental abuse.) Will this Parental Notification make the ballot? We should know within a couple of months.

HEALTH MINISTRY

FREE BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENING CLINIC

A clinic will be held on Sunday, February 7 in the parish hall from 8:30am to 12:30pm. These screenings are provided for you by St. Paul Health Ministry.

It is possible to have high blood pressure without any apparent symptoms, that is why it is often called, "the silent killer." Come to the clinic and let one of our nurses help you monitor and control your blood pressure.

What is high blood pressure?

It is a condition in which the force of the blood against your artery walls is high enough that it eventually may cause heart disease. Blood pressure is determined by the amount of blood your heart pumps and the resistance to the blood flow in your arteries. The more the heart pumps, and the narrower your arteries, the higher your blood pressure. You can have high blood pressure for years without any noticeable symptoms. Undetected and uncontrolled, this increases your risk of damage to blood vessels leading to serious health problems, including heart attack and stroke. Fortunately your doctor can easily detect the problem and can work with you to control it.

Help needed!

In an effort to provide more prompt service at our free monthly screenings, the Health Ministry invites parishioners with medical/clinical training and experience to help perform blood pressure screening. You need not commit to full membership in the Health Ministry. If you are a current or former EMT, military medic, doctor, dentist, pharmacist, or any other health care provider who is trained in taking blood pressures please drop by our clinic and offer your services for an hour or two. Recent clinics have resulted in long waiting lines and your assistance will be greatly appreciated.

EL GRAN HIMNO AL AMOR

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Cabe dudar que, cuando san Pablo se sentó a escribir lo que ahora conocemos como el capítulo trece de la primera carta a los corintios, supiera que lo que estaba escribiendo se convertiría en una clave principal de la ética cristiana. En este breve pasaje, ha consignado ideales sobre el amor que se han mantenido firmes en el transcurso de los siglos. A veces pensamos que porque estos son sólo ideales a los que uno aspira, estamos libres de no practicarlos en nuestra vida diaria.

Lo que Pablo estaba escribiendo era una carta a sus amigos, dándoles buenos consejos sobre lo que significaba —y todavía significa— vivir en el amor, día a día, en seguimiento de Cristo. Encontramos en las palabras a sus amigos una ampliación del gran mandamiento de Jesús de amar a Dios y al prójimo. Hoy en día escuchamos cómo este amor debe expresarse en nuestras acciones, y cómo debe regir nuestras relaciones con los demás.

En muchos hogares latinos el tiempo de Navidad terminó el día dos de febrero con la levantada del Niño Dios en la fiesta de la Candelaria. Es interesante como el pueblo cristiano tiene un cierto afecto para Jesús en su aspecto de niño. Desde hace siglos con el evangelista Lucas y la virgen María la imaginación cristiana ha ido buscando al Divino Niño en el templo; con san Cristóbal lleva cargando al Niño Dios sobre los hombros mientras cruza el río de la vida y san Antonio de Lisboa juega con el Niñito Jesús sobre un libro teológico mientras estudia la Palabra de Dios.

Fueron los monjes cistercienses del siglo XII quienes primero desarrollaron esta devoción al Niño Jesús. En su afán por conocer mejor al Dios hecho humano entraban por medio de la meditación imaginativa en los cuatro evangelios. Esta meditación es un entrar en la vida de Jesús de tal manera que vives los eventos en tu corazón y desarrollar así una relación afectiva con el Señor. La devoción al Niño Dios debe ser acompañada de la *lectio divina*.

LECTURAS DE HOY

REFLEXION

Primera lectura — Dios destina a Jeremías a ser profeta de las naciones (Jeremías 1:4-5, 17-19).

Salmo — Señor, tú eres mi esperanza (Salmo 71 [70]).

Segunda lectura — El amor con todas sus muchas facetas es la más importante de las virtudes (1 Corintios 12:31 — 13:13 [13:4-13]).

Evangelio — Cuando Jesús reclama que su misión salvífica es para todos los pueblos, los miembros de la sinagoga de Nazaret enfurecidos lo echan fuera (Lucas 4:21-30).

Las palabras de Jesús en la sinagoga causaron una doble reacción, según el Evangelio de hoy. Al leerlas, todos lo reconocieron como el hijo de José y María: al interpretar que Dios era Misericordioso y que era reconocido incluso por los paganos, como la viuda de Serepta y Namán el sirio, lo rechazaron violentamente. En cierta forma, es esta la vida de profeta que anuncia la verdad en medio de las confusiones que el mundo presenta. Se necesita repetir con mas frecuencia el texto de la segunda lectura, la descripción que hace San Pablo del amor a los Corintios, para que el eco de la lectura penetre las mentes y los corazones de todos por igual y cese el odio, el racismo y la violencia. El ministro, ordenado o laico, como Jesús, está expuesto a la aceptación y al rechazo, pero siempre ha de predicar el amor de Dios para todos por igual como verdad revelada en la palabra compartida en comunidad

MINISTERIO DE SALUD

CLÍNICA PARA DETECTAR LA PRESION ARTERIAL, GRATIS. Esta clínica se llevará a cabo el domingo 7 de febrero en el salón parroquial de 8:30 am a 12:30 pm. Este proyecto se proporciona para usted por el Ministerio de Salud de San Pablo .

Es posible tener la presión arterial alta sin síntomas aparentes, es por eso que a menudo se llama "el asesino silencioso". Venga a la clínica y una de nuestras enfermeras te ayudara a supervisar y controlar su presión arterial. ¿Qué es la presión arterial alta?

Se trata de una condición en la que la fuerza de la sangre contra las paredes arteriales es lo suficientemente alta que con el tiempo puede causar enfermedades del corazón. La presión arterial se determina por la cantidad de sangre que bombea el corazón y la resistencia al flujo sanguíneo en las arterias. Cuanto más el corazón bombea, y cuanto más estrecha las arterias, más alta es la presión arterial. Usted puede tener la presión arterial alta durante años sin ningún síntoma perceptible. Sin ser detectados y sin control, lo que aumenta su riesgo de daño a los vasos sanguíneos que conducen a graves problemas de salud, incluyendo ataques al corazón y derrames cerebrales. Afortunadamente su médico puede detectar fácilmente el problema y puede trabajar con usted para controlarlo.
