DRAWN INTO THE STORY

“We are witnesses!” The scripture readings for Easter Sunday concentrate on details reported by eyewitnesses. Listen carefully and you will be drawn into the stories yourself. Peter reports the good works Jesus did, his death on the cross, and his resurrection. The passage from John’s Gospel has us running to the empty tomb with Peter and John and peering inside to see the cloths used to cover Jesus’ body. Psalm 118 sums up our response: “It is wonderful in our eyes!”

What resurrection details do we see in our lives today? How have we died to our old lives and been raised up again with Jesus? Let us pay attention to the new life around us. It is wonderful in our eyes.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Fifty years or so ago, it was popular to teach that every Sunday is a “Little Easter.” Today, after several decades of intense liturgical reform, it is more proper to think of today as a “Big Sunday.” On every Sunday of the year, the Church is obliged to assemble, keeping the day holy. In most places, we hardly attain the goal of gathering all who are in Christ by baptism. Look around today and see what a Big Sunday looks like!

Our tradition speaks of remembering, *anamnesis*, as the antidote to “amnesia,” the tragic forgetting of who God is and who we are as God’s most beloved creation. On this Easter day, we are at our very best. We remember who God is, and we remember who we are in God’s eyes: beloved sons and daughters, reborn to eternal life in baptismal waters. We rekindle our candles and reclaim our baptismal promises. As a “Big Sunday,” today also reflects the character of festivity and leisure that should mark every Lord’s Day. We wear “Sunday best” today, and we may take some time, especially in the northern states, to stroll through a budding garden. It is truly a “Big Sunday,” and how different our lives would be if we took its values and traditions forward into all the Sundays of our lives.

PASTORAL COUNCIL

The meeting was opened by Paul Pham. Minutes were approved after corrections were made.

Old Business:

The Diocesan One Campaign & St. Paul Campaign held their first meeting. The Advanced Gifts chairpersons have been selected. Kick off will be April 3, beginning with a dinner. Details to follow.

Liturgy Committee approved purchasing 500 small binders to hold the "Order of the Mass" cards and hymns.

New Business:

Research continues to find a low cost option for seasonal hymns. A license is necessary for copying music.

Lenten Program is planned on Palm Sunday, March 27, to be led by Michael Poirier.

There are been several cars broken into during Mass. Announcements will be made to be more careful what you leave valuables visible in your vehicle. Place them in the trunk.

The door monitoring system in the Religious Goods Store has been repaired.

The Wi-Fi Fiber Optics network installation in the church is completed. All that remains is the installation of Access points needed to connect the network to the remote thermostats. Estimated completion is Easter weekend.

Dale Yamamoto presented a strategy and plan to implement Young Adults Ministry, stressing the importance of this ministry.

The Gente Puente is planning several raffles to raise funds for the Spanish Outreach Program. Due to ongoing campaigns this will take place in July.

Members of the Finance Council will make presentations at Mass for the Annual Catholic Appeal, February 20/21.

The Diocese announced a 24 Hours for the Lord Services Friday, March 4 to noon Saturday March in selected parishes. Confessions will be heard during this 24 hour service.

Bible classes will begin again after Easter.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Hace casi dos mil años María Magdalena fue muy de mañana al sepulcro de Jesús. Fue a rezar como muchos hacemos ante la tumba de un ser amado. Esa mañana ella se convertiría en apóstol de los apóstoles, primera testigo de Jesús resucitado de entre los muertos. Se visten con camisas y faldones largos de muchos colores, mostrando la belleza de la diversidad hispana. Ellos bailan en honor de esa santa mujer de Magdala y lo hacen sobre andas de casi un metro de altura. Ellos toman la imagen desde la iglesia de su pueblo en las montañas en el norte del país y la llevan bailando por las calles empedradas bajando al santuario que han preparado para ella. Todo el pueblo reza y festeja en honor de la santa que fue buscando un difunto y se encontró con el Señor de la vida eterna.

DOMINGO DE RESURRECCION

Domingo de Resurrección o Domingo de Pascua:

Es el día más importante y más alegre para todos nosotros, los católicos, ya que Jesús venció a la muerte y nos dio la vida. Esto quiere decir que Cristo nos da la oportunidad de salvarnos, de entrar al Cielo y vivir siempre felices en compañía de Dios. Pascua es el paso de la muerte a la vida.

¿Por qué la Semana Santa cambia de fecha cada año?

El pueblo judío celebraba la fiesta de pascua en recuerdo de la liberación de la esclavitud de Egipto, el día de la primera luna llena de primavera. Esta fecha la fijaban en base al año lunar y no al año solar de nuestro calendario moderno. Es por esta razón que cada año la Semana Santa cambia de día, pues se le hace coincidir con la luna llena. En la fiesta de la Pascua, los judíos se reunían a comer cordero asado y ensaladas de hierbas amargas, recitar bendiciones y cantar salmos. Brindaban por la liberación de la esclavitud.

Jesús es el nuevo cordero pascual que nos trae la nueva liberación, del pecado y de la muerte. El que cree en Cristo es hecho hijo de Dios. Esta adopción filial lo transformándole la posibilidad de seguir el ejemplo de Cristo. Le hace capaz de obrar rectamente y de practicar el bien. En unión con su Salvador, el discípulo alcanza la perfección de la caridad, la santidad. La vida moral, madurada en la gracia, culmina en vida eterna, en la gloria del cielo.
