SHARING OUR GIFTS

Autumn is the season for harvesting and sharing the fruits of our labors. This week's scriptures use images of the harvest, family life, pregnancy, and investment to describe the abundant harvest in the reign of God. We discover that sharing the gifts we have been given brings eternal rewards for everyone.

In the Gospel parable a master entrusts his possessions to three servants before going on a journey. Each is given some talents. What they do with those talents determines what the master will do with them when he returns. How about us? What are we doing with our talents? How will our Master treat us when he returns?

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Earlier we looked at how our Eucharistic Prayers have been enriched by the approval of several new prayers to augment the old Roman Canon, there are the four standard prayers, three for Masses with Children, and the most recent addition, the former Swiss Eucharistic Prayer with four alternative forms (now known as the Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for Various Needs and Occasions).

We also have two Eucharistic Prayers for Masses of Reconciliation. The source for these two prayers is the request by many bishops for a special prayer for the "Holy Year" of 1975. The first is based on and develops biblical texts on reconciliation. The second starts with the experience of living in today's fractured world, and how the Spirit calls us to reconciliation and peace. Everyone thought the pope would put strict limits on the prayers, but in the end he said he was willing to open doors that had long been closed. Although he approved them for a period of only three years, they were never formally removed from the *Sacramentary* and have been incorporated into the new Roman Missal.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 23 de noviembre de 1927, un pelotón de soldados conducía al jesuita mexicano Miguel Agustín Pro Juárez al paredón de fusilamiento. Uno de ellos le susurraba “perdóneme”. Miguel le respondió que no sólo lo perdonaba, sino que le daba las gracias por darle la oportunidad de dar testimonio de su fe derramando su sangre por Cristo. Días antes había sido arrestado y acusado de intento de asesinato contra el presidente mexicano Álvaro Obregón. En realidad su delito era el de bautizar niños, bendecir matrimonios, llevar la comunión a los enfermos y escuchar la confesión de los arrepentidos.

Miguelito nació en 1891 y entró al noviciado jesuita en 1914, al mismo tiempo que el gobierno mexicano comenzaba una persecución en contra de la Iglesia. Debido a esta situación, Miguel tuvo que hacer su formación religiosa fuera de México. Apenas pudo, regresó a su nación como sacerdote e hizo su pastoral a escondidas, sabiendo muy bien que podía ser martirizado.

Miguel decía a sus amigos que al morir iría al cielo y si se encontraba con santos resecos, bailarían un jarabe tapatío hasta hacerles sonreír para Cristo Rey.

DE DONDE VIÑO ACCION DE GRACIAS

Pero el *Día de Acción de Gracias* no es una celebración moderna, ya que hay constancia de que empezó a celebrarse durante el primer cuarto del siglo XVII. La mayoría de los historiadores apuntan al año 1621 y localizan a quienes iniciaron esta tradición en la **Colonia de Plymouth** (que hoy en día forma parte del estado de *Massachusetts*) Según explican crónicas de la época, un grupo de colonos llegaron hasta aquel lugar en los inicios del frío invierno de 1620. Iban desprovistos de lo más esencial y a las pocas semanas comenzaron a escasear sus alimentos, algo que provocó que muchos de ellos enfermasen y comenzasen a fallecer. Entrados en la primavera de 1621, un grupo de indios nativos fue al encuentro de los nuevos colonos, mostrándose afables y prestándoles todo tipo de ayuda y enseñanzas para que labrasen sus campos, de cara a cultivar sus propios alimentos. También les enseñaron a pescar y cazar, por lo que los nuevos residentes de la Colonia de Plymouth obtuvieron unos excelentes resultados, pudiendo tener buenas siembras. En agradecimiento a los indígenas les ofrecieron una celebración donde compartieron sus alimentos. Año tras año se tomó la costumbre de reunirse todas las familias de la colonia y dar gracias por todo lo conseguido en los anteriores doce meses. Ese acto es el que se señala como el inicio de la tradicional celebración del Día de Acción de Gracias. Next semana continua
