A BOOK TO READ

GIVE GOD THE GLORY

A curious feature of the first half of Mark's Gospel is the pattern of Jesus working a miracle, then telling the recipient of the miracle to keep still about it. Many theories have been offered: Mark is setting the stage for the great "secret" revealed when Peter will proclaim Jesus the Messiah at Caesarea Philippi; more skeptical commentators offer that Jesus, fully aware of human nature, knew that the way to spread the news was to tell people to keep it secret.

The insight into this secret-keeping that serves us well, however, is that Jesus was initiating his public ministry according to the pattern that Paul describes. He was doing it for the glory of God—not for his own benefit, but for that of all. Paul would later write in Philippians that Jesus "humbled" himself to become like us. And we see this humility at work in today's healing of the leper. Jesus is trying to reveal the presence of God's reign among the people, not so that he himself might receive the glory, but so that God would be glorified through him. Imitating this pattern, which Paul encourages the Jewish and Greek Christian factions in Corinth to do, still serves us well today.

LENT BEGINS

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday February 14. Mass will be 8:00am, 12:00noon and 6:00pm in English and 7:30pm in Spanish.

Lenten Regulations: Fasting & Abstinence

All persons 14 years and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent:

Everyone from 18-59 is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent is highly encouraged. Fasting is generally understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted but liquids are allowed.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected neither fasting or abstinence is obliged. Airport workers, travelers and others while on board ships or airplanes are dispensed from the laws of fasting for the duration of their journey.

Other forms of fasting include abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet and social media is spiritually beneficial and strongly encouraged.

CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH

EDUCATION:

"If you can't read, it's going to be hard to realize dreams."

BOOKER T. WASHINGTON (1856-1915)

A dominant figure in African American society in the latter part of the 19th Century. Among Washington's many accomplishments is the leadership of the Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute, founded in 1881. Washington's goal was to teach his students both trades and academics so that they could become teachers in the emerging schools and colleges for African Americans across the South/

During an 1875 speech at the Cotton States Exposition in Atlanta, Georgia, Washington described his philosophy for African American advancement. He felt that, rather than pursue legal and constitutional means for equality African Americans should focus on education and learning industrial skills such as carpentry, masonry, and farming as a means of advancement in society. He believed in cooperation not confrontation. He gained the support of business and education leaders across the country. He used the social and philanthropic influence to build rural schools and to serve as a spokesman for the needs of all African Americans in the South.

For African Americans achieving equality has been an uphill struggle, facing prejudice and other obstacles as they have worked to bring fairness in education for African Americans everywhere.

MARY MCLEOD BETHUNE (1875-1955)

Born of former slaves opened the Dayton Educational and Industrial Training School in 1904 with \$1.50, five little girls for students and plenty of hard work and determination. Eventually the school grew into Bethune Cookman College, where she became the first President and Co-Founder.

Bethune rose from her humble beginning as the youngest of seventeen children of sharecroppers to become special advisor to President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Special U.S. Observer to the United Nations Conference, Vice-President of the NAACP and Director of Negro Affairs in NYA during 1936-1944.

Bethune also became world renowned for her ability to mobilize resources to meet the needs of the African American community by leading voter registration drives and pressed for the integration of the Red Cross. Mary McCleod Bethune was also chosen as one of the fifty (50) Great Women of America.

A DIOS TODA LA GLORIA

Una característica peculiar de la primera parte del Evangelio según san Marcos es que en general Jesús obra un milagro y luego le dice al beneficiario del milagro que no se lo cuente a nadie. Se ha especulado mucho al respecto: Marcos está preparando el terreno para el gran "secreto" que se revelará cuando Pedro proclame que Jesús es el Mesías en Cesárea de Filipo; otros comentaristas más escépticos sostienen que Jesús, quien era plenamente consciente de su naturaleza humana, sabía que la mejor manera de difundir la Buena Nueva era pidiéndole a las personas que la mantuvieran en secreto. La reflexión de esta manera de guardar el secreto que nos resulta muy útil, sin embargo, es que Jesús estaba comenzando su ministerio público de la forma en que describe Pablo: lo estaba haciendo por la gloria de Dios, no para beneficio propio sino para beneficio de todos.

Pablo después escribiría a los filipenses que Jesús "se rebajó a sí mismo" para parecerse a nosotros. Y vemos cómo esta humildad se pone en práctica hoy en la curación del leproso. Jesús está intentando revelar la presencia del Reino de Dios entre las personas, no para recibir gloria sino para que Dios fuera glorificado por él. Imitar esta forma de obrar, lo cual Pablo sugiere que hagan las facciones judías y griegas cristianas de Corinto, todavía nos resulta muy útil hoy.

Esta semana recordamos a san Valentín, obispo y mártir. En EE. UU. se conmemora el amor de parejas, novios y esposos. Según la tradición, san Valentín, en el año 270, contradijo al emperador y casó a varias parejas después de que el emperador hubiese prohibido el matrimonio para mandar los hombres al ejército. Valentín fue encarcelado y allí se enamoró de la hija ciega del carcelero (en aquel tiempo los obispos y los sacerdotes se podían casar). El santo le dio la vista a la muchacha y se hicieron novios. Llegado el día de su martirio Valentín le dejó una carta de despedida con el carcelero. La firmó "De tu Valentín".

En algunos países latinoamericanos el 14 de febrero es la celebración del amor y la amistad. Los novios son importantes, pero la persona no puede vivir sólo con el amor de pareja. Los humanos estamos hechos para varios tipos de amor. Estamos hechos para el amor que nos trasciende a nosotros mismos. Este es el amor cristiano, el que no se limita a familia, amigos. El que es valiente, como lo significa Valentín, ama a todos aun a la persona que es diferente a uno. (San Valentín no está hoy día ni en el Santoral ni en el Misal Romano.)

No estrechar la mano. Ofrezcan el Signo de la paz a quienes les rodean con un simple gesto de asentimiento, diciendo: "La paz esté con ustedes".

No te cojas de la mano durante el Padrenuestro.

A los ministros extraordinarios de la Sagrada Comunión se les recuerda que se limpien las manos con un antiséptico a base de alcohol antes y después de administrar la Sagrada Comunión. Esto también se aplica a aquellos que llevan la Sagrada Comunión a su hogar.

La obligación de asistir a Misa el domingo y otros Días Santos no se aplica a aquellos que están enfermos. Si estás enfermo, quédate en casa y cuidate. Gracias por su paciencia y comprensión durante este tiempo, y ore por aquellos que están enfermos.

La administración de la Sagrada Comunión en ambos tipos se reanudará tan pronto como el Obispo lo considere seguro y prudente.

Para disminuir sus probabilidades de contraer un resfriado, mantenga su resistencia natural a través de una buena nutrición y de dormir lo suficiente y hacer ejercicio. Evite el contacto directo con los enfermos y lávese las manos con frecuencia.

Si tiene resfriado, sea respetuoso con los demás, cúbrase la boca al toser y estornudar y, si es posible, limite su contacto con los demás.
